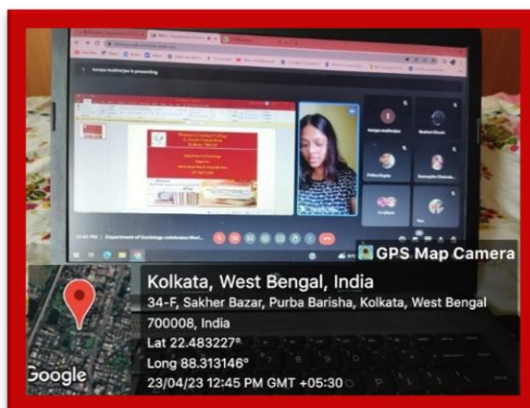
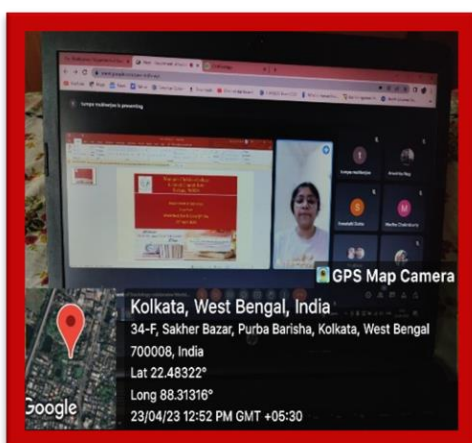
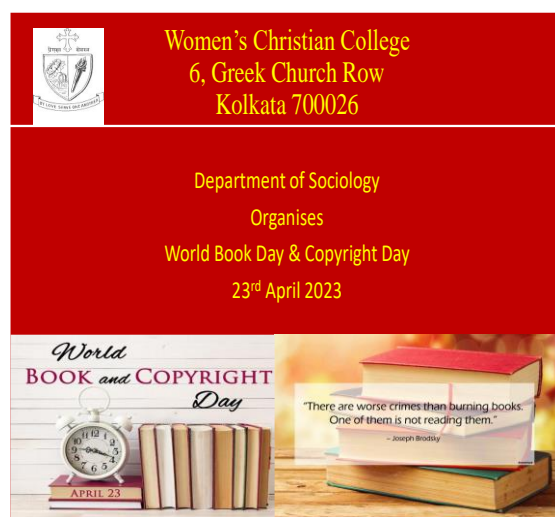


Report

Report - World Earth Day

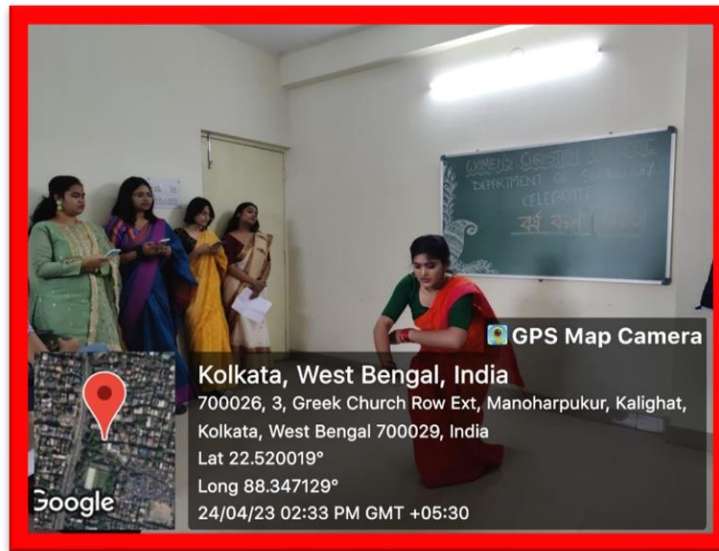

CONTRIBUTION OF PETER BERGER & THOMAS LUCKMANN TO THE UNDERSTANDING OF SOCIAL CONSTRUCTION OF REALITY

The lecture was presented by: **Dr. Pinaki Roy** Assistant Professor in Sociology (W.B.E.S.) Government General Degree College, Mangalkote, Purba Bardhaman.

Our speaker of the day, Dr. Pinaki Roy had completed his bachelor's degree in Sociology from the Presidency College, University of Calcutta, 2007. He received a Certificate of Merit from University of Calcutta for securing First Class First position in B.A. Sociology (Honours) Part I, II and III (2007 to 2009). He did his Masters in Sociology from Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi (First Class First), 2011 and continued his M.Phil in Social Sciences: Centre of Studies in Social Sciences, Calcutta & Jadavpur University, 2013, pursuing Ph.D. in Sociology in the Department of Sociology, Jadavpur University. He is currently the Assistant Professor and Head, Department of Sociology in Government General Degree College, Mangalkote.

The saying goes: *Man is in Society, Society is in Man*

One cannot separate man from the society like society cannot be separated from man. The lecture dealt with the study of social reality that has been one of the primary concerns of sociological learning. The concept has been addressed in a number of ways by various scholars but however a general agreement has been that reality is different from each individual. One's perception of reality is created by one's beliefs and backgrounds. Social reality bears a complex character because of its multiple layers of meanings and existence in different social contexts. Owing to its character as a non-unidirectional entity, it always receives theoretical attention from scholars interested in the study of society.

Dr. Pinaki Roy introduced us to the exemplary book: *The Social Construction of Reality: A Treatise in the Sociology of Knowledge* by Peter L. Berger and Thomas Luckmann (1966). The book is concerned with the sociology of everything that passes for knowledge in society. It pursues particularly the most commonsensical of knowledge which constitutes the reality of everyday life for the ordinary members of society. He introduces the important contemporary contributions of Peter L. Berger (1929–2017) an Austrian-born American sociologist and Protestant Theologian and Thomas Luckmann (1927–2016) an American-Austrian sociologist of German and Slovene origin.

Dr. Pinaki Roy talked about the "dual" concerns of the book — Society as Objective Reality and Society as Subjective Reality. The first concerns problems in the domain of sociology of knowledge while the second concerns problems in the domain of subjective consciousness. Primarily the book envisages a phenomenological analysis of the reality of everyday life. Reality is socially constructed just as gender and gender roles and sociology of knowledge helps address and analyze the processes through which reality is constructed.

WHY SOCIOLOGY OF KNOWLEDGE?

Dr. Pinaki Roy explained the subjectivity of reality that man takes for granted and while a sociologist cannot. He gave an example saying, the reality of a student attending a lecture in the classroom is setting in a room surrounded by friends and professors — this is his/her reality. Then it changes when the student goes out of the classroom and his/her social reality will be the street surrounded by cars. Thus reality becomes subjective. This helps us in the later understanding of Max Scheler's theory that focuses on different realities emanating from different societies.

Dr. Pinaki Roy further explained the objectives of Berger and Luckmann: Building Theory. The theorization is connected to the empirical discipline into concrete problems. He explained how the objectification of subjective processes and meanings by which inter-subjective common-sense world is constructed through empirical rather than purely scientific phenomenological method.

The discussion got further illuminated as Dr. Roy proceeded to explain the objectifications and subjective processes. He formulated the matters and segregated into two divisions namely:

Claim One: Society as Objective Reality, where he explained that Man's relation with the world and the environment is characterized by openness and the human social order is an ongoing production, explaining the externalizations of human beings which is impossible in a closed interiority.

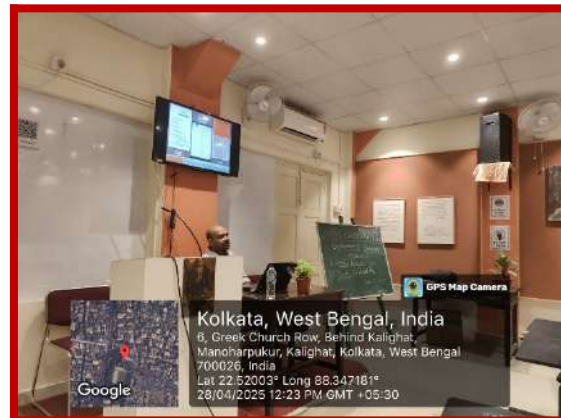
Claim Two: Society as Subjective Reality, where he explained the internalizations of reality. Primary and secondary socialization, further aiding the understanding of the people.

One of the most interesting portions of the lecture was the discussion of *The Everyday Life* where the question emerged if the everyday life sets off an illusion. Dr. Pinaki Roy elaborated that individual lives are just episodes in the externally patterned stream of time — exact, calendric — giving an example that face to face interactions are forms of everyday life as a reality shared with others.

Dr. Roy in his enlightening lecture aided the understanding of knowledge in the context of the dialectic of the individual and society. The understanding is neither based on the idea of an ahistorical social system nor an ahistorical human nature or human actors.

He concluded his lecture quoting:

“Society as part of the human world, is made by men, inhabited by men and in turn making men in an ongoing historical process...”

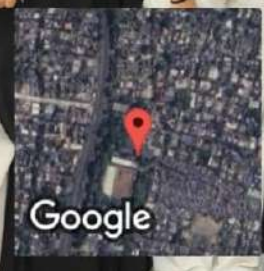

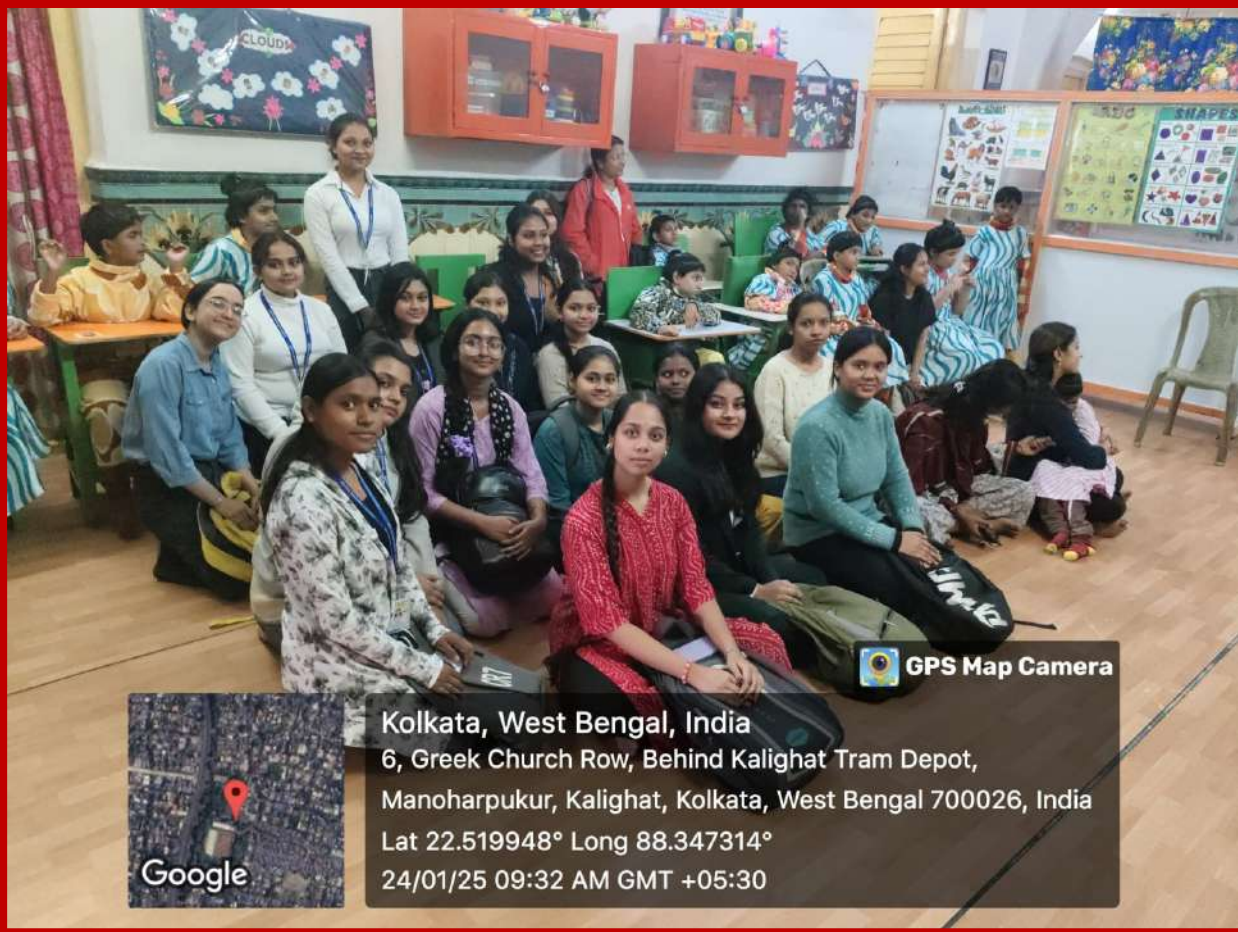

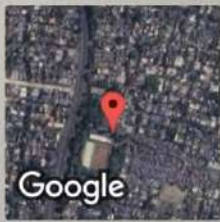

THIS REPORT IS BASED ON THE PRESENTATIONS PRESENTED BY THE STUDENTS ON THE TOPIC OF "ENVIRONMENTAL SOCIOLOGY"

DAY 1

The introductory presented by the first group (Medha Chakraborty and Nilasha Nath) was very descriptive, detailed and interactive. It covered the base and the origin of the relevant topic.

The second group (Sonakshi Dutta and Ishika Barua) chose to discuss on the presentation was descriptive and well interactive with the audiences. Important points were explained. There was a thorough discussion about the respective topic. The drawback of this group was lack of coordination among the member which is overlapping in the topic.

The third group (Reshmi Ghosh and Pritha Gupta) chose to discuss on the topic "TREADMILL OF PRODUCTION ". The group presentation was descriptive and well spoken. But the student faced lack interaction and explanation with the audience.

DAY 2

The fourth group (Riya Sardar, Priyanshee Nandi, Dipanjana sharma) chose to discuss on the topic "ECOLOGICAL MODERNIZATION". The group presentation was good. The main focus of this topic that is theory was not presented. Not all participants gave equal effort to highlight the topic and lack of coordination among the group.

The fifth group (Medha Chakraborty and Nilasha Nath) chose to discuss on the topic "ECOFEMINISM". The group presentation was a good effort, altogether well-spoken and detailed explanation. The drawback of this group was lack behind in using different teaching aids.

The sixth group (Amrita Chakraborty and Sriti Thapa) chose to discuss on the topic "POLITICAL ECOLOGY". The group presentation was good. The drawback of this group was that their presentation was too much lengthy and they were continuously repeating the same point, also there was lack of presentation.

Lastly, the seventh group (Moithily Roy, Shreyasmita Mukherjee and Angela Mukherjee) chose to discuss on the topic "SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT". The group presentation was informative and detailed. There is continuity in their collecting information. The drawback of this group was misinterpreted in some topic and they had faced difficulty in managing time leading to rushed conclusion.

The diverse selection of topic demonstrated a comprehensive understanding of environmental sociology. The interactive session kept the students engaged, with students asking questions and participating actively. Most group exhibited structured content some group used real word example and using PPT making their discussion engaging and informative. A few presentations lacked depth, focusing more on definitions than critical analysis.

At the end of the presentation Sathi Naik ma'am evaluate the member presentation of each group which assist each group to focus more on explaining the topic coordinating with team members and how to communicate with peers which will help to exercise to improve future session making them more inclusive and impactful.

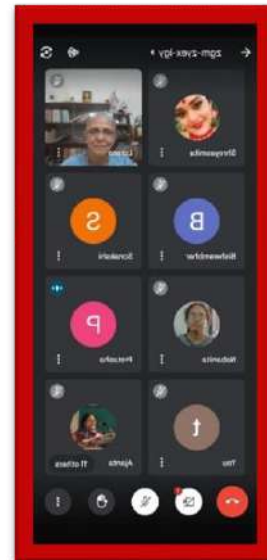
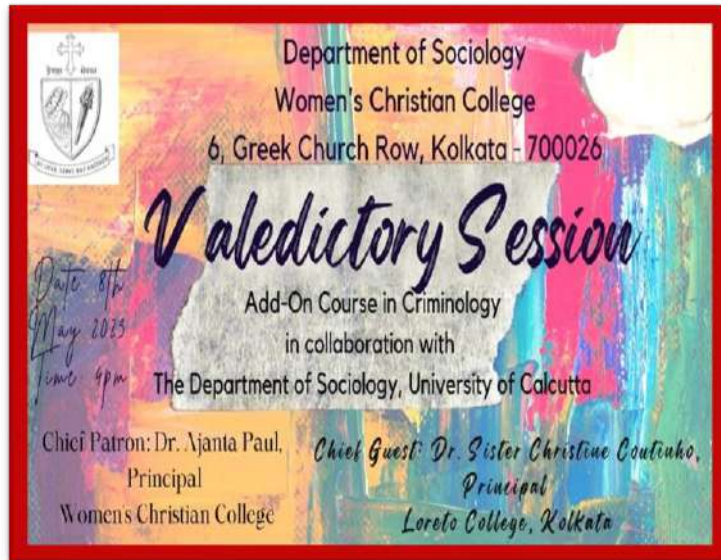


Report of the Add on Course in Criminology

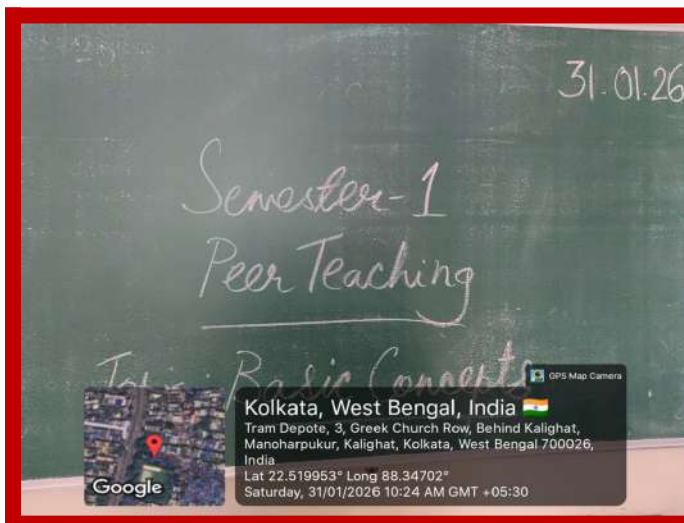
Parent-Teacher Meetings are held where teachers interact with parents of students and discuss their academic progress.



Peer Group Teaching of the Department of Sociology

- Peerteaching has long been used in academia as a method to improve learning outcomes. Peerteaching shifts the focus from the teacher to the student. Traditionally, teachers were the primary source of knowledge and instruction. However, peer teaching is a student-centered approach that emphasizes student involvement and active participation in the learning process. Peer teaching empowers students to take ownership of their learning by actively engaging with course material and teaching concepts to their peers. Rather than passively receiving information from the teacher, active learning strategies ensure students engage in interactive learning experiences, which promotes critical thinking, problem-solving, and collaboration skills. By actively participating in the teaching and learning process, students develop autonomy and take responsibility for their own learning outcomes. Encouraging lifelong learning habits: Peer teaching cultivates a culture of lifelong learning by promoting curiosity, inquiry, and continuous self-improvement among students. Peer Teaching is organised by the Department of Sociology. A topic is assigned to the student, they teach orally or through PPT to their fellow class mates. This helps the student to prepare their lessons. It helps to increase their oratory skills.
